### 4. HCoM Liaison Roundtable

#### Alberta Treaty Area Liaisons

- Oopportunity for HCoM Liaisons to provide update on activities, issues, and concerns unique to the communities they represent
- Anne Bird YTC Liaison shared pandemic caused allot delays distruptions deal with losses grief violence suicide
  and homicides; area represent 2 Nations isolated Rocky Mountain House issues; not seeing results from all
  FNIHB iniatives; elders not being supported properly not able to transfer traditional knowledge down for support;
  FNIHB only has functioning role need someone to deal with crisis that's beyond; participate at workshops but how
  is information transferred is concerning; serious fracture not able to utlize elders cultural ways; families vunerable

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need to see more outcomes from initiatives in terms how helping against real issues; Elders have great attributes but what gaps has the pandemic caused against elders to support families; public health restrictions have been a yoyo rollercoaster ride this past year; hard to be creative ang gather within communities held virtual sessions but still issue as not all have computer equipment at home; have protocol within their area and needs to be continued to be practiced

- Andy Alook shared community facing similar challenges not easy to practice; biggest concern public health risk
  i.e., bring people together, had to be creative too, could share ideas with Anne
- Caroline Adam-Courtoreille COVID played huge part in their communities not being able to meet in person only zoom capabilities; hope pandemic coming to end, many communities unable to do work or hold events; pandemic has taken huge toll on many people
- Kavita Prasad inquired if there's going to be any more grant for mental wellness dollars that can be applied for
- FNIHB shared for grants not sure what will happen to COVID funding knows Nations accessed thru ISC, has no clear answer
- Andy Alook a project working on with Alberta Health have been working on a recovery care program but it's been delayed because of COVID it was due for this fiscal year to wrap up but they're looking at providing that opportunity again to anyone else that might want to apply for grant if and when it comes out; there are other resources in terms of mental health that can support communities and it was called a recovery care coaches but this was to be in partnership with like any new initiatives such as our recovery care program or a recovery care program like Blood Tribe but it was just an additional resource but not specific to funding, they're going to be announcing any new funding more towards the new fiscal year from Alberta Health but at this point knows there was nothing confirmed yet it's just what heard based on the projects been working on
- Shannon Doubleday shared info about Alberta Health there are mental Wellness related addictions related funds
  or grants coming available. The province has a big focus on expanding the number of treatments and the concept
  of recovery communities, there might be opportunities there, could reach out to Alberta Health Corrine Everington
  to join the Subcommittee for a presentation

- Colleen McDonald shared ECN developing MW CRT and appropriate training for crisis response within community
- Kavita Prasad shared Alberta health has a grant called PCADA or the protection of children abusing drugs aktan so they have a couple of facilities throughout Alberta for that under 18 population and right now they're doing an evaluation of this action they're looking for members to be part of their task board so I can send information to the Subcommittee but I thought I'd just put that out there in case anyone is interested in being part of that task force and learning more about; shared a couple of years ago there was a grant opportunity available through

Alberta Health which they applied for and shared information within our communities regarding PCADA and we found out that no one was aware; so if interest or want them to come and present, can assist with coordinating that

- FNIHB Co-chair replied if able to share would be great, if Subcommittee see value for future agenda item can be brought forward
- Tina Apsassin shared that she was the policy analyst for treaty 6 and listen to the nations and the health directors in the nations. She works closely with them and her role is to support them with their needs including funding opportunities, T6 nations have been really hit hard recently with a lot of loss specially in the new year; shared her loss and grief which hasn't been easy and bares heavily on mental wellness; concurs with Anne, Caroline and Colleen, communities need enhanced supports; has reviewed the opioid report recently released, the rates related to accidental overdose is quite concerning and it's alarming, is a firm believer in data and data does tell the story that there's an issue here in our nations that we really need to focus and pay some attention too, we really need to move an action some items in regards to the opioid crisis thinks that it has to be a priority now, have been talking in circles about this thinks we need action now, can't sit back and watch these rates continue to increase, knows of

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the opioid working group but haven't seen anything really come from that just yet, we had a number of meetings but that's all it's been and I just really want to encourage that we move ahead with that working group and start coming up with something that's going to support the nations with what they're dealing with

- Crystal Beaverbones shared her job description and role for O'Chiese First Nation
- Laurie Belcourt shared role as Co-Management Liaison
- Deborah Hardy appreciates the collaboration amongst Subcommittee
- Dion Napio understood one of the mental health and addictions like some of the stuff that is coming up and some
  of the RFP's and kind of a hard decisions especially with 2022 coming up. There will be a lot of hard decisions
  coming up for mental health and addictions within this year just given all the different factors from missing murder
  indigenous women, residential schools, COVID-19 etc., There will be a lot of our decisions coming within this year;
  need to look at in future teaming up with other HCoM Subcommittees
